TOMCC NATIONAL AGM

NORTHANTS TOMCC JOINED THE NATIONAL AGM AT SYSTON

On Sunday 7th April eight of us (Stephen Rattley, Steve Leadbetter, Henry, Phil Short, Phil Barton, Kirstie Watson and Mark Lloyd) attended the TOMCC national AGM. The weather was pleasant apart from the wind which at one point almost blew me to a standstill. I think Henry was the only attendee on Meriden machine. There were about 100 attendees in total from all around the country although I didn't hear any Scottish voices.

A summary of the decisions made were:

- 1. Family membership to be offered to two triumph owners in the same household with full rights but only one copy of Nacelle at a reduced annual fee.
- 2. Contributions to branches After a long discussion the per capita contribution to the branch from HG to remain at the current rate despite increased HQ costs mainly associated with the production and postage of the magazine.
- 3. Annual membership fees To counter balance point 2 an increase in the annual membership fee was agreed by a vast majority of the meeting. It was pointed out that the fee had not risen for a number of years despite the cost of living increases and the lower price when compared to other bike clubs.
- 4. Digital Nacelle A proposal from Ian Waumsley of South Lincs to offer Nacelle via an electronic version with the option for a member to opt out of receiving the paper version via post was hotly debated with passionate advocates on both sides. In the end the proposal was accepted with the members' preferences to be captured via a tick box on the TOMCC website which would offer the option to reverse their decision. Using the electronic version would save the club the postage.

Other procedural matters were put before the meeting and a favourable report from the membership secretary was presented. The club current has approximately 8000 full members. Possible way of making other branches more active, like ours, were discussed with a better use of area reps being one of the key suggestions. Ian was held up as a shining example.

It was my first AGM and I enjoyed the debates and socialising (and the buffet). Next year there will be changes in the national committee due long term officers standing down, so consider coming along and impacting the direction the nation club.

THE ACCIDENTAL RACER

2024 DRAG RACING SEASON IS UNDERWAY

Easter weekend saw the first round of the 2024 ET Bike drag racing championship get underway. Easter is traditionally the season opener and is a three day meeting starting on Good Friday, but this year was changed to a no-spectator, two day meeting as, like most of the country, the public parking and camping areas were waterlogged and unusable. Friday became the test day that had previously been penned in for Thursday.

The change worked out well for me as a family funeral prevented me from arriving before Friday and more wet weather meant the track was only open for around an hour.

Saturday dawned dry, bright and somewhat sunny. Splendid. Three qualifying sessions were listed in the running order and, as is often the case, ET Bike was the last class to run in each session, meaning Q3 would be around 6pm if all ran to plan.



This weekend was the first run out for the Street Triple in its new colours. Which rapidly earned me the moniker 'Dayglo Dave' from the Santa Pod commentary team. The only other change was new chain and sprockets, which I reckon was the cause of my issues over the weekend.

Q1 didn't feel good. A judder at the end of first gear, continuing through second had me backing off slightly to clear it. I wasn't sure whether it was mechanical or a traction issue. I still ran an OK time, 10.85 on a 10.50 dial in, but this would need to improve to have any chance of a decent qualifying position. Q2 was awful, juddering through first I went to short shift to second and hit neutral. Whoops. Back in the pits I discovered

that the new chain had a massive tight spot resulting in way too much slack opposite. I'm pretty sure it wasn't there when I fitted it a month ago, so I slackened everything off, added a generous coating of lube, realigned, adjusted and tightened it all back up. Better.

Q3 showed a decent improvement, no judder and a much better run. Not great, but good enough for P9 from 17 and a reasonable draw for the first two rounds.

What a difference a day makes. We woke up Sunday to fog and a damp, grey day followed. The Santa Pod track crew, as always, were on the case from 7 am prepping the track and getting things underway on time.

Round one had me paired against Justin Malton on his newly built ZX12 for its first outing. He had had a few teething problems in qualifying so was pretty much an unknown. As always with drag racing you should never take anything for granted and run you A game every round. I ran fully to 1000ft, but as Justin had problems at the start, I was able to back off to ensure I didn't break out.





Round 2 paired me against new racer Kyle Rushby on his busa. Kyle had dialled in a 12.50 against my 10.60, which meant I had to sit on the start line for almost 2 seconds after Kyle set off. I passed him at the 1000ft and was again able to roll off the throttle before the line again.

Round 3 was a different matter. Phil Pratt, 4th last year whilst getting his new clutch set up and consistent. He had won every ET Bike championship every year before that. I reckon he is set up properly now. He had a 0.09 second reaction time and he ran 0.0003 of a second over his dial in. Game over. Especially as I ran 0.3 over my dial in, the judder was back and, just to add insult to injury, I had a 0.03 second red light too.

Overall, a decent start to the 2024 championship. If my calculations are correct, I am currently in fifth place, just 10 points behind Robbie Dobbie. At this point last year, I was languishing down in 19th place, finishing in third at the end of the season.



A BLAST FROM THE PAST

THE ORIGINS OF THE DOUBLE-DIGIT AWARD

I recently had the please of discussing the origins of the Double Digit Trophy with Bob Miller. The award is a model of Bob's own hand, many years ago, and continues to be proud to see if awarded regularly to Northants TOMCC members for silly mistakes. Bob also kindly shared one of the previous articles that touched on the Double Digit, from a Vibrations edition in 1983, reproduced in a later edition.

It is the intention of the Northants Branch to rescue from the Vibrations archives articles about the branch or its members, so that they can reach a new audience today via the medium of our website.

This will take some time as the newsletters date back as far as 1979 and the quality of reproduction doesn't always lend itself to easy transfer.

The first Vibrations to be rescued was the March 1987 issue, which chronicled the first 10 years of the branch's existence. This second edition contains two overlapping articles by ex-member Bob Miller, relating how he got into motorcycles in general and into Triumphs in particular. The first article:

"How Triumphs Adopted Me In 1961"; appeared in an undated (and untitled) newsletter in 1981. The second composition: "In The Beginning"; dates from September 1983, by which time the newsletter had become Vibrations and was published bi-monthly.

Due to the relatively low-definition photocopier we had access to at the time Vibrations in the early days didn't carry any photos, but as technology has progressed we are now able to illustrate Bob's writing with some photographs from his collection.

We would like to thank Bob for writing the original articles and for trusting us to take care of his photos while we scanned them.

Bob's other significant contribution to the Branch was providing us with the Doubler Digit trophy, which has been awarded over the years to members who have committed some really silly or, in a few cases, really painful deeds.

Most recently the Double Digit Trophy was awarded to Mick Moseley at the Northants TOMCC AGM for a fueling error.












Parts book for 650cc models, circa 1960 (reprint)




Parts book for T90/T100 "C" range models (reprint)







Machine displays will be taking place in the covered paddock, there will be trophies to win. Categories will include:-






