The Challenge

Ride your Triumph in and around Northamptonshire, including adjacent villages and towns, where their first letter forms part of the spelling of PINT OF BEER.

At each location take a photograph of your bike adjacent to the town/village sign which denote the letter in PINT OF BEER

For example - PIN"T" could be a picture at "T"OWCESTER.

Entry Submission

When you have completed your route through Northants and have taken all 10 Photographs for each letter of PINT OF BEER, send them in an e-mail to Branch Secretary Les Barras at: secretary@northantstomcc.org.uk. Please include the date that you finished the challenge.

Event Timing

You have until December 2022 to complete the challenge. It's up to you whether you do it all in one day or over a number of rides. If you have more than one Triumph then you can use different machines for different sections.

The Grand Tour - Lands' End to John O'Groats and Back Part 1

It was an idea born from a spirit of adventure in 2019 when I took a notion to make a circuit of mainland Great Britain. Being in possession of a large touring motorcycle and conscious that for me the sand in life's hour glass was running through the hole at an alarming rate there was no time to waste.

My friend Francis was enthusiastic from the start about coming with me along with his buddy Jeff.



We had an opportunity to meet up in July 2019 and started to develop a plan.

Our original chosen dates were in June/July 2020 and as I was taking delivery of a brand spanking new BMW RT1250 tourer in March it was to be perfect timing.

We were due to meet in Plymouth to begin a clockwise circumnavigation of mainland England and Scotland. All the accommodation was researched and booked. Then, quite out of the blue came the awful Covid 19 pandemic and everything had to be immediately cancelled.

There was to be an abortive attempt to resurrect the tour in 2021 but as we know Covid 19 comes in different variants and we weren't out of the woods yet.

With some trepidation in March 2022 and the situation for travel apparently easing I started to prepare for another attempt. I reviewed my earlier plan and set to making the reservations with thirteen Hotels and Guest Houses for Grand Tour 2022.

A valid piece of advice for anyone contemplating a motorcycle tour of any type or duration is don't follow my example and throw yourself off your push bike at speed onto the pavement, thereby injuring your left shoulder and right thumb a week before you are due to go.



A tentative 50 mile ride out on the BMW two days before departure confirmed that I could manage, just!!.



I finally left home on 30th June 2022 for the first 'leg' of the journey and my Guest House arriving in Plymouth soaking wet.

It was a comfortable guest house in Plymouth at only £50 including breakfast and secure parking for the bike, not bad at all.

Suitably rested and dried out I made my way to Plymouth Hoe and the ferry port to greet my travelling companions. They drew up on their bikes, Francis on his beloved Harley and Jeff on a Guzzi 85, neither with the barn door of a screen like the BMW.

First stop for the group was St Michaels Mount. Then off we headed to Land's End for the mandatory photographs.
