

#### **Membership Fees from January 2018:**

The club's membership fees increase on 1<sup>st</sup> January 2018 – which is the first increase in 5 years. The Full/Past/Magazine Subscription rate goes up from £20 to £22, with Associate Membership rising from £7.50 to £8.

If your membership is due make sure you get it renewed by 31<sup>st</sup> December, otherwise you will have to pay the increase. If you really want to save money you can take out the 5-year membership instead of the 1-year, that way you get 5 years at the current rate.

## **Motorcycle Theft**

Earlier in the year I attended a meeting at Kettering Police social club regarding stolen motorcycles. We have not had a meeting like this for many years because of all the cut backs.

Sergeant Shaun Marshall opened the meeting, saying that in 2016 there were a total of 440 Powered Two Wheeler theft's in Northamptonshire. That's 189 in Northampton area, 96 in Kettering, 31 in Corby, 18 in Daventry. Only 48% of machines were recovered.

Several people at the meeting who have had a motorcycle stolen complained that the Police did not turn out and did little to help them. Even when the location of the stolen machine was reported the Police did not respond. The Police say they need proof beyond all doubt (it would seem then that the thief has more rights than the victim).

PREVENTION is the key to keeping your pride and joy.

Ensure you purchase security chains, locks and ground anchors bearing the "sold secure" logo.

Have Datatag on your motorcycle.

Use a Thatcham approved alarm and immobiliser.

Fit a Tracker

Interestingly, a rep from a Tracker firm gave a talk saying that in the last 5 years 92% of motorcycles recovered had a tracker fitted.

#### SECURE YOUR MOTORCYCLE AT HOME

A Garage is the most secure place to store a motorcycle at home but make sure you use your locks and chains. Fit an alarm to the garage. On an up-and-over door use mortice bolts on the bottom corners of the doors and into the frame. Other doors should have BS 5-lever mortice lock and hinge bolts.

Consider bricking up any windows.

And lastly did you know that you can register your off road motorcycle for FREE with the DVLA by completing form V55/5 and declaring your machine will NOT be used on the road.

## **MOT Exemption Changes from 2018**

Owners of some classic bikes will be spared the annual trip to the MoT station after the government annual dot station after the government and the governmen

Previously vehicles manufactured before 1960 were exempt from the annual inspection but the new rules mean some 50,000 or so more bikes do not need an MoT test.

The new rules, which come in during May 2018, bring Britain in line with most of the rest of Europe and will work on a rolling 40 year basis. As of next spring, all bikes built before 1978 will fall under the new rules, meaning that classic bikes like Triumph Bonnevilles, Honda's iconic CB750 and the Kawasaki Z1 will, in theory, be cheaper to own and run.

The 40 year rule also applies to vehicle excise duty (road tax), which are exempt from any fees, although riders will still be required to have valid insurance for their classic bikes.

These new regulations also apply to classic cars and do place an emphasis on owners to ensure their vehicles are in a roadworthy state. While an MoT certificate will no longer be compulsory, drivers and riders may still present their vehicles for a voluntary MoT test and it remains their responsibility to ensure that their vehicles have no defects that would see it fail the government tests when they take to the public roads.
